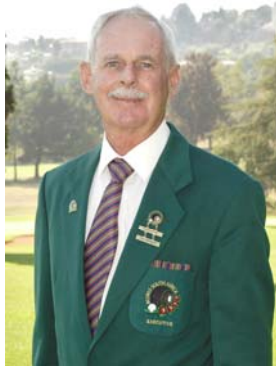

## EDITORIAL/ REDAKSIONEEL



The Annual General Meeting of Bowls South Africa, which was held at Edenvale Bowling Club on 25 August, can be regarded as a turning point in more than one respect. For the first time in more than a decade the annual decrease in the total membership of affiliated bowlers was down to a minimal 2%, with no less than 8 of the 20 Districts recording a gain in their membership during the period from 1 April 2006 until 31 March 2007. This could be indicative of the fact that the efforts of Bowls South Africa, the Districts and clubs have reached the point where the decline is about to be converted into an increase in the number of affiliated bowlers in the country. It is believed that the data base and centralized issuing of membership cards will reflect the true and exact number of bowlers that participate in the sport of bowls. Once Districts and clubs start enforcing the mandatory producing of a membership card at all events under their control, all players that set foot on a bowling green, shall be obliged to affiliate, thus becoming part of the family of bowlers that contribute financially toward the maintaining, administering and developing of the sport that they participate in. After all, why should unregistered bowlers enjoy the same privileges as those that are willing to pay their dues to enable them to play the sport that they enjoy. The proposed system will be operative in 2008.

A further turning point at this year's meeting was the relaxed and positive attitude shown by the delegates at, not only the AGM, but also at the workshop the previous day. It was encouraging to experience the openness and cordiality of the delegates during all discussions. Although not all points up for discussion were adopted or defeated unani-

mously, the discussions took place in a spirit of "seeking the best decision in the interest of bowls".

Die gesindheid wat deurgaans tydens die verrigtinge geopenbaar is, was in 'n gees van samewerking en spanwerk. Daar was nie sprake van "ons" en "hulle" nie. Dit was duidelik dat almal wat teenwoordig was die belange van die sport rolbal voorop gestel het. En dit was duidelik uit die gesindheid wat geopenbaar is. Hopelik is dit die begin van 'n nuwe era in die bestuur van rolbal, waar alle besture, komitees en werkspanne as 'n eenheid saamwerk, sonder eie agendatjies en eie "ekke" en eie eer wat onderlinge samewerking en eenheid vertroebel nie. Per slot van rekening, dit gaan in die eerste plek om die sport wat ons dien en geniet.

Although there were three new candidates nominated for the Executive (all very able and competent persons), the AGM decided to return the serving members to office. This in itself served to confirm the attitude detected throughout the proceedings, namely that the vast majority of the Districts were comfortable and satisfied with the efforts of the Executive to fulfil their respective duties. Said Piet Breitenbach after the AGM: "This Executive is working and I am happy to have them back as part of my team."

#### **17 Julie 2007 - BOLAND DIE NUWE ONDER/25 ROLBALKAMPIOENE.**

Na 'n week se harde rolbal het die span van Boland verras deur as oorwinnaars van die O/25 Rolbal Inter-Distrikte, wat verlede week in Bloemfontein gespeel is, uit die stryd te tree. 18 van die 20 Distrikte het vir hierdie kompetisie ingeskryf, sommige waarvan meer as een span ingeskryf het. Van die groter Distrikte het twee en meer spanne ingeskryf. Elke span het individueel meegeding en enige van die 38 spanne, wat deelgeneem het, het 'n kans gestaan om te wen.

Die vroeë gunsteling om te wen was Suid-Vrystaat, wat die kompetisie in 2006 gewen het. Ofskoon Suid-Vrystaat sonder drie van sy jong sterre moes klaarkom, het hulle in die rondomtalie stadium van die kompetisie sterk vertoon en het, behalwe vir een wedstryd, wat hulle teen Westelike Provinsie gelykop gespeel het, al hulle wedstryde gewen. (Die drie spelers waarsonder hulle moes speel was Clinton Roets, Wayne Perry en Handré Marais, wat almal in die Suid-Afrikaanse span is, wat tans in Skotland is, waar die Atlantiese Internasionale Toernooi plaasvind).

Nadat Boland in die halfeindstryd met die span van Oostelike Provinsie afgereken het, en Natal Binneland verras het deur die span van Suid-Vrystaat oortuigend te klop, het Boland teen Natal binneland in die eindstryd te staan gekom. Boland het vriend en vyand verras deur die sterk span van Natal Binneland, wat as die gunsteling beskou is, oortuigend met 22-11 te klop en sodoende vir die eerste keer in die geskiedenis van die kompetisie as kampioene van die baan te stap. Boland se span was: Stephan de Jager, Darius van Loggerenberg, Ezile Fourie en Schalk Mouton.

Die naaswenners was Natal Binneland met Oostelike Provinsie in die derde plek.

### 10 September 2007 - SPANNENDE EIND-STRYD BY S A GEMENGDE ROLBALPARE.

Die S A Gemengde Pare, wat verlede week in Kimberley gespeel is, het Saterdag op 'n hoë noot geëindig toe die span van Noord-Vrystaat, bestaande uit egpaar Arra en Ansie van Niekerk, die span van Natal Binneland met Gilbert Wyatt en Heather Hancock, oortuigend geklop het. Die finale telling was 24-19. Noord-Vrystaat het die hele wedstryd voorgelooop en telkens hulle opponente met goeie skote onder druk geplaas. Wat hierdie uitslag nog meer merkwaardig gemaak het, was die feit dat die Van Niekerk egpaar die dag tevore berig ontvang het van die skielike afsterwe van Ansie se moeder. Hulle het desnieteenstaande voortgegaan en daarna al hulle wedstryde gewen en so-ook die finaal, waar die vlag van Noord-Vrystaat halfmas gehang het

In die ander eindstryd, waar Sentraal Gauteng (Gianni Gatti en Rosalie van Breda) en Gauteng Noord (Bert van der Linde en Ina Jooste) om die Brons medalje uitgespeel het, het die dinge eweneens interessant verloop. Nadat Sentraal Gauteng aanvanklik redelik gemaklik voorgelooop het, het die span van Gauteng Noord terug geveg. Met die aanbreek van die laaste skof, was Sentraal Gauteng een enkele punt voor en Gauteng Noord wat 2 punte benodig het om die wedstryd en die brons medalje te wen. Met die witte in die sloot, het Gauteng Noord een skoot gelê met nog net die laaste bal van die wedstryd om gespeel te word deur Gauteng Noord se Bert van der Linde. Hy speel toe 'n baie goeie bal en trek daarmee die wenskoot om sodoende die wedstryd en die brons medalje te wen. (22-21).

Daar was in totaal 20 spanne, een van elke rolbaldistrik, wat om die hoogste louere meegeding het. Die deelnemers was almal die wenners van hulle onderskeie Distrikte se gemengde pare kampioenskappe.

### 27 August 2007 - ENTIRE EXECUTIVE OF BOWLS SOUTH AFRICA RE-ELECTED.

The entire Executive of Bowls South Africa was re elected at the Annual General Meeting, which was held at the Edenvale Bowling Club on 26 August. The Executive consisting of the President, Piet Breitenbach (North West), Vice-President, Debra Ferguson (Eastern Gauteng), Tys Pringle (Limpopo), Isabel Smith (Sables), Allan Freeman (Border) & Kallie Haupt (Southern Cape), all of whom were returned to office, in spite of them being opposed by three other nominees who were Michael Marsden (Western Province), Sarel Herbst (Sables) & Ashley van der Muller (Eastern Gauteng). This can be regarded as a great vote of confidence in the members of the Executive, now unchanged since 2005, by the majority of the 20 Districts.

At the Annual General Meeting it was also noted that the decline in the total membership experienced over the last number of years has stabilized at 2%, declining to a figure of 32097, which compares favourably with all other sporting codes in the country. It is envisaged that the efforts to turn this tendency around to an increasing membership, will bear fruit in the forthcoming period and that an increased figure will soon be shown. These efforts evolve around a very ambitious and effective development program largely aimed at transformation, youth and corporate business, the coming into operation of a data base coupled to an efficiently controlled membership card system. In all, 8 of the 20 Districts showed an increase in membership during the past year with Northern Cape showing the largest increase. Presently Western Province boasts the largest number of members (4204) with Central Gauteng in the second place (3577) and Port Natal third (3282). The Districts with the smallest number of members are Sedibeng (501) and Limpopo (570), the latter being one of the Districts that cover a vast geographic area ranging from the Northern border with Zimbabwe to Thabazimbi and Lephalale (Ellisras) near the Botswana border in the north west of the Limpopo province.

### 30 September 2007 - PROTEAS ARE AFRICAN BOWLS CHAMPIONS.

The South African Proteas won the African States Bowls Championships, played at Windhoek in Namibia last week and were once again crowned as the African champions by proving that they are still the top bowls country on the African continent. Both the South African Men's and Women's team were the overall winners of the tournament when they won 6 of the possible 8 gold medals and 2 bronze medals. Gold medal winners were the men's Fours (Billy Radloff, Wayne Perry, Handré Marais & Clinton Roets), the Men's Pairs (Billy Radloff & Wayne Perry) and Men's Singles (Brian Dixon who convincingly won all his single games). The women Proteas won gold in the Fours (Lorna Trigwell, Cheryl Cox, Loraine Victor & Sylvia Burns), the Trips (Lorna Trigwell, Loraine Victor & Sylvia Burns) and Singles played by Colleen Webb. The Bronze medal winners for South Africa were the Men's Trips (Brian Dixon, Handré Marais & Clinton Roets) and the Women's Pairs (Cheryl Cox & Colleen Webb), who both lost their first two games on the first day of the tournament; the men's Trips lost to Zimbabwe 16-18 and to Namibia 17-22, whilst the women's Pairs went down to Zimbabwe 15-17 and to Swaziland 15-18. Although both these teams came back strongly to win the rest of their matches convincingly, they could only manage to win the bronze medals.

The South African Singles players Brian Dixon and Colleen Webb both impressed with their determination and constant high standard of play, thus putting their opponents under constant pressure. Particularly in their last games against the very determined players of Zambia, both had to fight back after trailing in the early stages of their games. Brian Dixon was 9-19 down and came back to win the game 21-19. Colleen Webb was 6-13 down and eventually won the game 21-17.



The countries that participated were South Africa, Namibia, Botswana, Kenya, Malawi, Swaziland, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The African States Tournament will be hosted by Zimbabwe in 2008.

Piet Breitenbach, President of Bowls South Africa, was pleased with the performance of the South African teams. He said that the teams are well balanced and that the combinations are working. With the forthcoming World Bowls in New Zealand in mind he was cautiously optimistic saying that the preparation of the teams is on course and with hard work, dedication and total commitment of the players, South Africa could well become the World Champions at World Bowls in 2008.

The South Africans depart for New Zealand soon to play a test series against the home side on 9, 10, 11 & 12 October. This is seen as an important part of the preparation for World Bowls and will give the players the opportunity to play on the fast greens in New Zealand.

In November the Namibian World Bowls team is to visit Cape Town to play South Africa in a series of 2 tests

## GRASS CLIPPINGS 12

In this issue we are going to concentrate on how to apply the nutrients and how much to apply at any one time.

When fertilising the GKP has three objectives

- To replace any of the elements used by the grass plant.  
13 mineral elements within the soil are recognized as being essential for plant growth. The GKP should ensure that they are, at all times, available in the soil.
- To rectify any imbalances which might be revealed by the Soil Analysis report or by other reports.
- To use certain fertilisers to stimulate growth

Before the GKP can proceed further he must first obtain certain information from -

- The Soil Analysis
- The Player Count

### 1.0 SOIL ANALYSIS

#### 1.1 pH

Turf grass performs best in a slightly acid medium. A pH between 5.5 and 6.5 (HCl) would be considered ideal and the GKP would only be expected to keep it at that level.

A reading below 5.5 would require the inclusion of some liming material. A mild adjustment could be achieved by using LAN (Limestone Ammonium Sulphate) as the main source of Nitrogen whereas a more drastic adjustment would require the use of Lime, Dolomite, or Magnesite in the fertiliser programme

Decreasing the pH is more difficult. A pH in excess of 6.5 often occurs as a result of the application of liming materials or the use of alkaline irrigation water or top-dressing. A mild reduction could be achieved by the use of the Sulphates of Ammonium and Iron.

More drastic reductions would require the use of Elemental Sulphur (about 20 Kgms per green year.

#### 1.2 Cation Exchange Capacity

In the Soil Analysis report the laboratory will provide the GKP with –

The total C.E.C. or T-Values

- The relative percentages of the main elements – Calcium (Ca), Potassium (K), Magnesium (Mg) and Sodium (Na)

1.2.1 C.E.C. This is a measure of the ability of the soil to “hold” the elements in the root zone for absorption by the roots.

It is known that there exists an electro-static attraction between negative and positively – charged entities. In the soil a negatively-charged anion will attract a positively-charged cation.

These negatively-charged anions can be found attached to “sites” on the surface of the particles which make up the soil. Cations already present in the soil will become attached to them.

Once attached these cations cannot be removed by leaching water **but they can be replaced or “exchanged” by other cations**

When the GKP applies the nutrient elements to the surface of the green and they are carried into the root zone dissolved in water the positively – charged cations of Calcium (Ca), Magnesium (Mg), Potassium (K), Copper (Cu), Manganese (Mg), Zinc (Zn), and Iron (Fe) will replace many of those cations already attached to the anions.

The number of cations which can be so exchanged per unit of dry weight is called the Cation Exchange Capacity of the soil. - and is measured in **milliequivalents (mEq) per 100 gms** of the soil

The C.E.C. of a soil sample is directly related to the surface area available on the particles and, therefore, related to the texture of the soil – the smaller the particle the greater the number of particles and total surface area which could harbor sites for the anions.

Clay particles have negative charges scattered all over their surfaces. Each one of these negative charges will attract cations and hold them in an exchangeable form eg CEC = 30+

Sand particles also have negative charges on their surfaces but because their total surface area is so much less than that of clay they would have much fewer anions and, therefore, “hold” fewer cations. Therefore, sandy soils have a much lower C.E.C, eg CEC=0-4

### **BOWLS SOUTH AFRICA DATABASE**

This has been a long and difficult task that is near completion. I apologised at the Annual General Meeting for the delay with the cards and the non-printing of some of them for this year. We had major problems with some clubs and the download of their information corrupted the database. We have rectified what we could and it is now up to clubs to check and rectify their information.

The procedure for the 2008-year will be as follows:

All clubs must have their membership up to date as at the 31<sup>st</sup> December when the entire database will be removed. All members will then be allocated a new Bowls South Africa number. This number will remain with the member for the rest of your bowling career.

The members that are on the Database as at 31<sup>st</sup> December will be invoiced to the District and they in turn will invoice out the clubs. Should you have members on the system that are no longer members of your club you will be liable for the affiliation fees.

Should a new member join the club, the club will apply for a number, which will be allocated, and the District invoiced. This affiliation fee will be charged pro rata.

This is a very basic programme and very simple to use but it will only benefit all if every club maintains their members. There are many benefits of this system for clubs.

1. You will never have to retype your membership again.
2. Your information is confidential and secure.
3. Any change of Secretary or corruption of his/her computer will not affect you.
4. Movement of members will be managed with ease.
5. Reporting to District will be simplified.
6. Easy verification of members entering your tournaments.
7. Reconciliation of your annual fees simplified.
8. Applications to sponsors showing target market is an advantage
9. There will be more of a control on novices.
10. No need to write information on bowls cards. They will be printed

Once the database is running smoothly we will proceed with uploading the player's records, which will assist with selection at Club, District and National level

I appeal to all clubs to work on their membership and get their information correct before our deadline date. Together we can move forward.

#### LEVEL 2 COURSE NEWS

The Assessors have just successfully completed the first phase of the Practical Assessment of this years' upgrading course. Assessments were carried out at Margate Country Club, Kenton on Sea, Greatbrak River, Somerset West (Helderberg B.C.) and Sol Plaatjies B.C. in Kimberley. The standard of the candidates this year was high and this, coupled with the opportunity to meet with members of the respective Standing Committees made the lengthy trip extremely worthwhile. Final assessment and moderation of the candidates will take place shortly, together with the candidates in the Gauteng area, and the whole procedure will be completed as soon as possible,

Other course news comes from Border, Mpumalanga, Central Gauteng, North West, and Northern Cape. Our Standing Committees are indeed busy – thank you all.

Kingfisher has just completed a very successful Refresher Course attended by no less than 33 coaches. Border have also just completed a similar course attended by 12 coaches, and are planning another Club Coach course for early next year.

A Refresher Course will be held in Middleburg, Mpumalanga, on September 29<sup>th</sup> and all coaches are encouraged to attend for updating their information regarding recent changes in the coaching world.

A combined updating and Refresher Course will be held in North West on October 17<sup>th</sup>, probably in Potchefstroom with details still to be finalised and once again all coaches are encouraged to attend to hear the latest news regarding coaching.

Northern Cape is also planning a combined Club Course and Refresher Course, hopefully before the end of this year, with details still to be finalised.

Central Gauteng are hoping to run a Club Course later this year that could include Sedibeng, Sables and their own District with dates still to be confirmed. Please keep in touch with your respective Standing Committees.

It is hoped that the proposed upgrade course for Level 3 will be held towards the end of this year with

dates and venue to be finalised and announced shortly.

Coaching is alive and well and continues to be more professional so we extend a very big thank you and well done to all concerned.

#### A FRIENDLY REMINDER

A friendly reminder to all coaches - your qualification only lasts for four years. After four years you should either have taken an Upgrading Course or at least attended a Refresher Course. Remember that coaching is never static and that changes and modifications are common.

We are fast approaching the end of the year and the time when we need to update our database. Please ensure your logbooks are up to date and that the appropriate data is given to your district standing committee on the approved form. At this time it appears that only 34 percent of our coaches are active and with the future activities planned we will only be considering those coaches on the "active" list for involvement in the various projects.
