NATIONAL STANDING COMMITTEE FOR TECHNICAL OFFICIALS SET THEIR OBJECTIVE FOR 2010.

In order to create and maintain a well trained and competent squad of Technical Officials (Umpires) in each district, Bowls South Africa Executive has invested some of the Lotto grants in the Capacity Building Project for Technical Officials.

In order to ensure uniformity in the training standards and the application of bowls rules by Technical Officials throughout South Africa two "Training of Technical Official Course presenters" courses were conducted for 2 members of the Technical Standing committee of each bowls district. The one course was presented in Potchefstroom during August 2009 for the ten northern districts and the other course in Amanzimtoti during October 2009 for the ten southern districts.

The purpose of these two courses was to equip the Course Presenters of the various District Technical Official Standing Committees with the necessary knowledge and skills to run courses successfully in their districts and also

to ensure a uniform standard throughout South Africa.

After the 2 courses were conducted the National Standing Committee had a look at the number of bowlers that was trained in the previous two years and then set the objective for 2010.

Technical Officials trained in 2008 was 232 persons and in 2009 - 438 persons.

Our objective is within reach and we appeal to all Bowlers who want to qualify them as a Marker or as a Level 1 Technical Official to contact their District Technical Official Standing Committee for course dates.

The new Learning material we use is of a high standard and the learning is great fun. I guarantee everyone that you will learn a lot and that you will enjoy the course.

BOUNDARY STRING

As all the countries affiliated to World Bowls Ltd. are using the same Law book, it is necessary to ensure that the methods and instruments use by a Technical Official to measure for a shot or to determine whether a bowl or jack is in play are also the same. South Africa complies with all the methods and instruments except when it comes to determine whether a bowl or jack on the boundary is still in play.

In South Africa we are still making use of the mirror, while all the other countries are using a Boundary Scope or a Boundary String.

As the Boundary Scope is not suitable for the conditions of our grass banks and it is also quite expensive, the National Standing Committee for Technical Officials decided to rather make use of the Boundary String.

As with the introduction with any new and unfamiliar instrument there will be a great RC factor (Resistance to change) and there will be some teething problems to sort out before all the Technical Officials are familiar with this new instrument and the method to use it, but if we want to be competitive and in line with the other countries, we have no option.

To use it is quite simple and it is more accurate than the mirror. If the correct method is followed when using it, a decision can be made much faster than to set up the mirror.

Cost wise it compares well with the cost of a mirror and we are going to phase it in to replace the mirror over a 2 year period.

.Boundary string

The boundary string is a length of string on a reel. It is suitable for deciding whether a jack or bowl is within the boundaries of the rink of play.

When using a boundary string.

1. Make sure you are asked for your judgement before stepping in.
2. Secure the loose end of the string with a 100mm nail to the green next to the ditch board inline with the mark on the ditch board that indicate the position of the boundary peg (if the ditch board is

not marked – insert the nail inline with the centre of the boundary peg.)

3. Ask an assistant to walk with you to the other end of the green. Make sure both you and the assistant do not encroach into the adjacent rink.
4. When you reach the bowl or jack in question, hold the string ± 50 cm above the bowl or jack to ensure the string do not disturb the bowl or jack.
5. Your assistant proceeds to the other end of the green with the boundary string casing, reeling out the string as he walks.
6. He then insert a 100mm nail into the green , next to the ditch board inline with the boundary peg mark on the ditch board (if the ditch board is not marked – insert the nail inline with the centre of the boundary peg.)
7. The assistant then tighten the string and wind the string a few times around the nail, to ensure the string is very tight.
8. Lower the string till it is on the green. Make sure that at no time the string disturbs the bowl or jack.
9. If you still cannot decide by looking down, slide a square up to the bowl or jack from the side of the rink of play until it just touches either the string or the jack or bowl, then make the decision.
10. Quickly re-wind the string as you move from the rink. (Make sure you do not disturb the bowl or jack if it is still in play.

Jack or bowl in the ditch.

1. Put the string in place as described above.
2. Use the engineers square to extend the line over the ditch.
3. Look from above and make the decision.
